Save us from violence, discord and confusion; from pride and arrogance, and from every evil way. In the time of prosperity, fill our hearts with thankfulness; and in the day of trouble, suffer not our trust in thee to fail. Amen

I bid you to include this modified version, or the original, in your daily prayers at least for this month as we prepare to change, and then change, leadership. It may not be a bad idea to make it a permanent addition to your Daily Office as the year progresses.

I went out to eat the other day, and the waitress, in idle conversation, asked about my plans for Christmas. I started by saying I would go to church. She didn't even let me finish my answer.

She jumped in to say everyone should start Christmas by going to church. She went on to say that what our nation was lacking was church-going and praying. That's why there was so much violence and selfishness permeating our society.

She, of course, was preaching to the choir. I'm not sure she remembered that she was even talking to a priest. She did promise that church was on her schedule. Then she tsk-tsked and was on her way.

I think our nation needs more praying. I ask you to join me in putting this into action in January. It will do no harm, doesn't cost anything and will help our country and our own prayer life.
