Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

March 5^{th} happens to be the beginning of this year's Lenten journey. That's right, March 5^{th} is Ash Wednesday. It seems late, but that's just the way it worked out this year.

To help us focus on this topic, I will use Wayne Simsic's book, <u>Praying with Thomas Merton</u>. It is one among many of the *Companions for the Journey* series, published by Saint Mary's Press. Other titles currently available (either from me or the Christ Church library) are (Praying with) Benedict, Catherine of Siena, Dominic, Francis of Assisi, Hildegard of Bingen, John of the Cross, Julian of Norwich, Teresa of Avila and Thomas Aquinas. Each would be a worthy companion in Lent.

The Merton book contains suggestions for its use: carve out intentional time and space; open oneself to prayer; preview each meditation; read the meditation; and, reflect on the meditation (various ways are given).

The 'Introduction' contains a brief biography. While his personal history is informative, sketching aspects of his formation (and he certainly did suffer his own 'slings and arrows of outrageous fortune'), his spiritual journey is even more important.

Thomas Merton was a twentieth century Trappist (the Cistercian Order of Strict Observance) monk. He was a passionate, prolific writer on spirituality and mysticism who maintained that, "the contemplative experience, which leads to a unique unity with the divine and a new vision of life, is not only for monks but for all Christians." (p. 15)

Merton is appropriate for us today because he is a spiritual master who invites us down a path we all can follow. He reminds us that all of us can receive the gift of the contemplative experience if we are true to God's call and grace on our own pilgrimages.

The book contains 15 brief meditations (5-6 pages), with prayers and exercises in each. Some of the meditations also contain drawings, for those who enjoy that medium. It is an enlightening book, a worthy companion for the 2025 Lenten journey.
