Having examined the prayer For Travelers (BCP p. 831) in last month's article, I thought we would examine the prayer For Returning Travelers (in **bold** below) in this issue. It is not in our BCP, but was written upon request when I was in Skokie. Like last month, I am following the parsing of Barbee and Zahl in their book, *The Collects of Thomas Cranmer*.

Almighty God, (the Address) We could pray to lots of different people: Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of the saints. This prayer talks directly to God the Father, just the way Jesus prayed.

creator of the universe, (the Acknowledgement) This optional honorific is included to remind us that we are the creatures who have been out and about in God's creation.

we thank you for the journey of [name(s)] safely ended (the Petition) This isn't a 'petition', but a thanksgiving. We take too many trips without even bothering to thank God for our safe return. This is appropriate.

and for the many persons who served [him/her/them] in [his/her/their] travel. This begins to address the point made above. How often do we acknowledge the importance of others who actually do work which we take for granted?

We thank you for your guiding hand We are all in God's hands, all of the time. Sometimes we forget this, too.

preserving [him/her/them] from dangers, seen and unseen, along the way, We see some dangers. We don't see others. This covers everything.

for your presence at every destination The Psalmist (Psalm 139) asks, "Where can I flee from your presence?" The final answer becomes obvious, 'nowhere': ie, God is everywhere and anywhere we go.

and for returning [him/her/them] safely to us, There is no place like home. Just ask Dorothy. Home is special, and it's always good to be back.

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (the Pleading) There is no Aspiration in this prayer, and that's OK (it's optional). The closing is how Jesus told us to pray: through him.
